### 4. Content report PV

#### 4.1. Activities

Already in the phase of doing the application and with contacts with the partners (+ Creativeliteracy workshop in June 2014 ) two points had become clear to which all the participants wanted to focus on: It was considered important that people would be activated to discuss together with the current time-related questions. Another important issue that was considered was, that some people are excluded to the margin of their issues because they do not have the necessary skills (especially ICT capabilities) to participate to the debate which is, in large extent on internet. Even before the summer workshop, as a result, it was found that to the creativity, which is in all people, there should be found opportunity and channel to become for the common good.

It was envisaged that the first meeting would be designed for future cooperation guidelines, in between the meetings, local actors would design a program to fit to their regions and in the second meeting the local functions would be integrated into a common goal.

When we got NORDPLUS decision the grant was for one meeting only. We asked for permission to hold two meetings and it was granted to us. We are very grateful for that.

In addition, it was considered important that the virtual space would be taken into account as part of the space in which the learning takes place.

Partners were unchanged, but in Turku there were included more actors during the process, who were very interested in our project

In the first meeting in December (Turku 17-18.12.2014) it was focused on the ideas for the possible future project. In the meeting there were used functional and inclusive methods, as we are using normally in the joint functions of library of Turku and the Turku Women's Centre.

In the two-day meeting, on the first day it was focused in developing new ideas on the basis of the actions already realized and having new perspectives what kind of ideas could be developed around contemporary challenges (supporting adult key skills, the modern mega-trends: climate change, population change, globalization, digitalization and the rise of the experience society). It was found a lot of ideas.

During this work, it became however clear that all participants have a lot of same type of ideas and so Thematic Network was already born. The work continued with developing ideas in all three locations.

We were building a thematic network at first. On the second day, it was decided that we will change our plans so that instead of the thematic network - theme, we'll start to design a development project. This project will primarily focus on 1) how we could develop inspiring functions to the challenges of the time regarding regional needs, so that the actors and residents would be interested in them and will be

eager to develop their key skills and 2) we would develop supporting functions in which will be taken into account different learners.

Between two meetings regional teams in different areas developed the most suitable functions for their areas and applicable to the signs of the time.

#### 4.2. Results and outcomes

At the second meeting in Tallinn (4-05.02.2015) these ideas of the teams were introduced and together we developed a mechanism (a web-based tool kit) in which the functions will be developed such that the diverse learners are taken into account as much as possible. The Tool kit was decided to build as a tool for library staff, the third sector operators, teachers as well as other operators, which can easily introduce the methods to be part of their own work.

In the second meeting, we also built the budget, which each partner made for their own needs and plans.

And the application was submitted NPAD-2015/10290. In this application, the main applicant is the Turku City Library, because they have the best chance to take care of financial matters.
